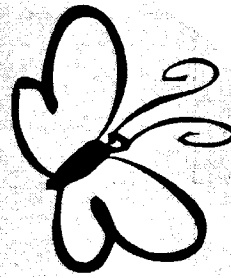
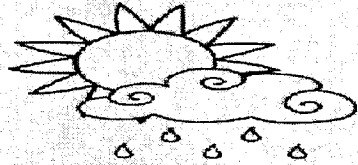
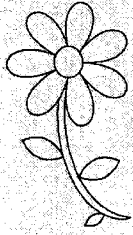

Ware still GEEKing at the library. In April, we have a wonderful event planned for DIY Spring

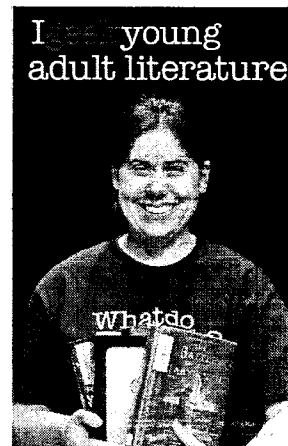
Cleaning! In May, we will finish up with a gardening event before moving on to summer reading!

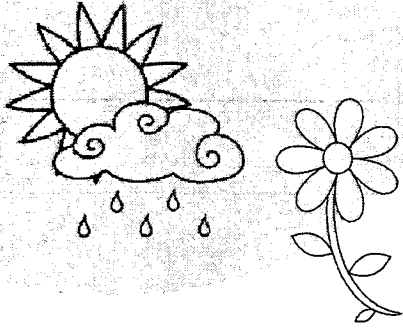
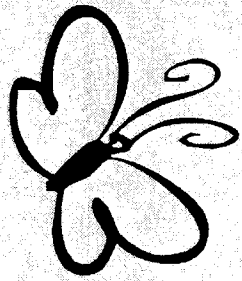

It is almost summer and the summer schedule is just about complete. We hope to have it finalized within the next week and perhaps by the time you read this, we will have it out to you!

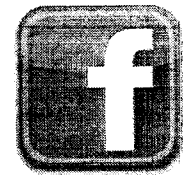
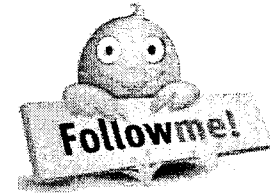
We are busy planning summer reading and can't wait to join the kids in all things Su-
