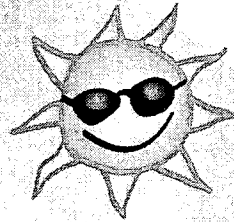

Have you ever wondered what your toys would do in the library overnight? Find out in Kenmare on June 24th at 6:00 pm—8:00pm.

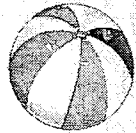
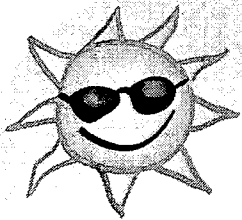
This event is for ages 3 to 5 and you must sign up for the event. There will be pizza and games and then the toys spend the night! Please keep in mind to not bring your

## From The Administrator

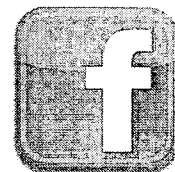
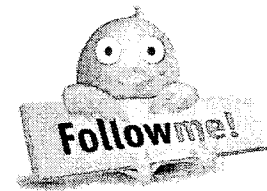
The weather has warmed up and the sun is shining. The summer schedule is in full swing and it is already time to plan the schedule that starts in the fall.

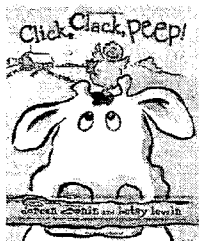
We are looking forward to moving and will need volunteers to help us move. If you are interested or would like to be put on the possibly interested list, please give Kerri a call in Minot.

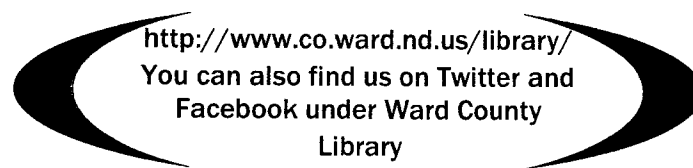


The Ward County Public Library offers library users of all ages a varied fiction and nonfiction collection in various formats including books, magazines, DVDs, videocassettes, and audio books. Additionally, free internet is available on state-of-the-art PCs as well as via wireless delivery.

On our website, library users can access several online databases. These electronic resources can provide a means to research numerous full-text articles in magazines and reference sources.

Drop in and browse our Used Book Room, which has books and other materials in good condition available for purchase at great prices.

Copy and fax services are also available for a small fee.



## **Coming Soon to your library!!!! ROBOTICS!!!**

This fall, the library hopes to bring in a robotics kit to have available for use in the library and perhaps some programming in the future.

These electronic kits have circuits that can be snapped together and hooked together with wires to make various tools that can poten-

tially make life easier.

They are part of the maker movement that involves technology and hands on learning. They are designed to foster exploration and innovation. More information can be found at <http://littlebits.cc/> education.

These kits will not be available for check out to start with, but that will be something that we would look into for the future.

We will have more information in the fall about when the kit may arrive and what else you can expect with it. We wanted to give a lit-

tle teaser for what is to come.
